

TALKING POINTS & GUIDELINES

Thanks for helping educate the public that the Equal Rights Amendment has met the requirements outlined in Article V to be added to our Constitution.

There can be NO discussion of candidates/races (funding requirements). You CAN ask if someone is registered to vote, wants to check their registration, and/or knows how to vote early and in person (the ideal combo).

Only engage in conversations about EQUALITY and do not get baited into discussing candidates/parties/races. Someone could have a camera rolling.

Oops! if you say something you shouldn't, mop it up with, "Sorry, that's my personal opinion and not the position of VoteEqualityUS."

- The Equal Rights Amendment <u>IS</u> part of our Constitution because it has met all the requirements to be added to the Constitution. Thus far, the federal government refuses to recognize it.

- 168 international constitutions guarantee gender equality and so should ours!

- The Equal Rights Amendment will protect all Americans from sex discrimination, including our LGBTQ+ citizens.

- The Constitution provides *greater protection* than laws, which can be easily changed; over 90% of Americans support constitutional gender equality.

- Sex discrimination in the United States costs us \$2 Trillion annually.
